In applying for the WAYK 2017 Summer Intensive Internship, I understand that...

- not only will the WAYK house will be a “dry house” (i.e., no drugs or alcohol will be allowed on the premises) but interns are asked to commit to a “dry summer.”
- new romantic relationships between members of the team or between the WAYK team and members of the host community are strongly discouraged.
- all participants are expected to share responsibilities when it comes to cooking, cleaning, and chores.
- due to limited housing availability, there is a possibility that we will be assigned to a living space that requires roommates.
- everyone is expected to be respectful of shared space, quiet hours, and the “Meadow.”
- no visitors will be allowed during the Summer Intensive.
- interns should not bring additional (outside) projects with them to complete during the Summer Intensive.
- interns are expected to prioritize the language goals of the community above their own personal language goals.
- interns will NOT engage in behavior that could be distracting or detrimental to the project. This could include, but is not limited to:
 - debating political issues such as global warming, offshore drilling, marriage equality, or the legalization of marijuana
 - publicizing the language and the project through social media or other means without explicit permission from community members
 - making the assumption that everyone should feel obligated to learn their heritage language.

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Instructions for Video Application

Please note: This is the first year we are experimenting with video application submissions. We have done our best to devise a smooth system for video submissions, but if you do encounter issues while trying to submit a video application, [let us know](#) and we will try to resolve your issues as quickly as possible.

Required Questions:

- Tell us a little bit about yourself.
- Do you have any specialized interests, skills, or experiences that qualify you to participate in the Summer Intensive?
(for example: working with Native communities, living in language immersion situations, or traveling abroad, language documentation, creating and archiving audio and video materials, teaching or working with children)
- Tell us about your language learning (or teaching) experiences.
How did you learn the languages you know? What are your best and worst language learning experiences? What language learning/teaching methods are you familiar with, if any?
- Why do you want to intern with WAYK this summer?
- What leadership roles have you held at work, school, etc?
- What do you hope to gain from an internship with WAYK this summer?
- What are your future plans beyond this summer?
Will you return to work or school in the fall? Are you hoping to use your summer experience in your current career or in a future career?
- How will you be able to stay involved with and contribute to WAYK's work in the future?

How to submit the video portion of your application:

1. Record yourself answering the required questions.
2. Edit and export your video.
 - **Save your video in a universal format (.mp4 is preferred)**
 - **Label your video file with your first and last name**
 - **Videos may not exceed 9 minutes in length**
3. Upload your video to our Dropbox. We have created a [special folder for these file requests](#). You do not need to have a Dropbox account to submit your video this way. **Be sure to allow ample time for your video to upload!**

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
